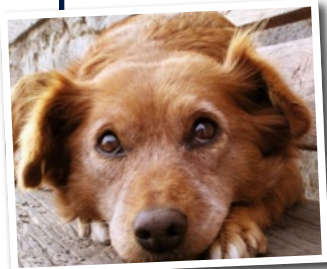
Roland Davis and Jason Morris
