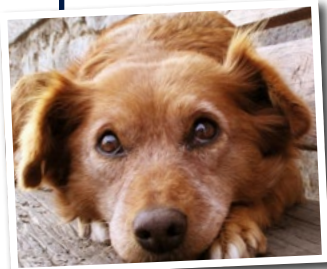
### Keven Underwood and Sharon Scott
